IMMUNIZATION RECORDS



You will need to provide proof that you have had the following vaccinations:

1. **Proof of 2-Step TB Test within the past 12 months.** (*Receive test injection, have it read, and repeat test approximately 1 week later.*)
2. **Proof of 2 MMRs** (*Measles, Mumps and Rubella*) Immunizations or proof of titers for *Mumps, Measles and Rubella.*
3. **Proof of Tdap Vaccination** (*The Tdap vaccine became available in 2007.*)
4. **Proof of Varicella Titer, vaccination, or knowledge of having had chicken pox** (*Varicella*). *If you had the chicken pox, provide a signed written statement indicated such.*
5. **Proof of Hepatitis B Titer OR proof of the 3 vaccinations OR signed declination.** *If you choose the declination you will need to provide a sign written statement indicating such.*
6. **Proof of Influenza Vaccine** *for the most current flu season.*

Where can I look for old medical records?

- **Family records:** Family records such as baby books may contain immunization records.
- **Doctor's office or clinic:** Check with all health care providers where shots may have been given, including neighborhood clinics and local public health departments.
- **School or child care provider:** Child care providers and schools must verify immunizations for attendees and may be able to look up records.
- **Military records:** Immunization information may be available to those who have served in the military.
- **An immunization registry:** Registries are confidential, computerized systems for tracking immunization records. They are managed by state or local health departments and are accessible only by health professionals who give immunizations or those required by law to record immunizations for enrollment. You will need to provide:
 - The name on record
 - Date of birth
 - Year entered kindergarten or transferred into the school system
 - School name
 - City
